Ancient Egypt Research Project

Project Due Date: Monday, December 2, 2019

During our study of Ancient Egypt, you will research a specific topic, complete a research and create a PowerPoint presentation. Each research project must have a minimum of 3 sources from which you have found information, with at least one source being from paper (book, magazine, etc.). Each scholar will have a maximum of three minutes to present his or her PowerPoint to the class.

Requirements

- You will be graded on your use of class time, your PowerPoint, and the oral presentation of your PowerPoint (see the rubric).
- Each PowerPoint must have a minimum of 7 slides and a maximum of 10 slides. (Times New Roman, font size 12 14)
- The first slide must be a Title slide with the title of your project, your name, and your class. (Font size and style varies)
- At least 3 of the next slides must present key ideas from your research.
- You must incorporate at least 3 graphics or photographs into the presentation.
- The last slide must be a bibliography of the sources you used for your presentation. All information must be properly cited using the proper citation method. (see sample)
